A Message from our Compost Coordinators

Hello Gardeners.

We encourage you to consider applying more soil amendments (beyond the vegetable based compost delivered by the city) to your garden plot. There are lots of options to consider when choosing an amendment, but it could be as simple as organic composted chicken, cow, or horse manure.

By doing this you will be more likely to have healthier, more disease resistant plants. An added bonus will also be plants that produce more vegetables. The additional organic matter added to your soil not only adds nutrients, but also increases the water holding capacity of your soil resulting in less need to irrigate.

Update on the at the Cornerstone Site

We met with the property owner, the engineers, the soil remediation contractor, and the storm water collection system contractor yesterday and received more details on the planned work. Based on that I was able determine where we need to move the raised beds and assign them to gardeners. That plan has been delivered to the Cornerstone raised bed gardeners. Nothing on the west slope will be affected.

• The SGAD work day is this Saturday, April 16 We hope to get all the

raised beds moved then. We are asking that the PPCG gardeners stay clear so that the 56 volunteers from SGAD who have signed up can work efficiently.

- The excavation work will start in late April. They will start with the
 west side of the property (where the garden is located) first and
 expect that to take a week.
- They will backfill the area with soil before turning the area back over to us to occupy in mid-May (estimated).
- We will move the Surly raised beds and the rest of the raised beds in place after they are finished.
